Human Research Protections Training Changes for NMHC Researchers

We are excited to announce significant updates to the Human Research Protections Training process. Northwestern University and Northwestern Memorial HealthCare (NMHC) have expanded their ongoing partnership to rely on the Northwestern University Institutional Review Board's (IRB) expertise to assume IRB oversight for all NMHC research. As a result, all NMHC researchers will complete Northwestern University's Human Research Protections Training (CITI) course. The course will now automatically integrate with researchers' eIRB+ accounts, making the process easier and more efficient.



Right now, no action is required unless you receive a notification that your study has been selected for routine **Post-Approval Monitoring**. IRB submissions and review processes remain unchanged. Over time, we will transition all routine monitoring activities into the workspace to ensure a smooth adjustment.
